ColliCare launches Import & Export train between Italy and Sweden

January 2023

Following the success of the direct Parma-Rolvsoy Norway service, ColliCare wants to replicate the same service on the Italy - Sweden axis. Starting in February 2023, the first direct train will depart from the Cremona terminal – focusing on efficient and environmentally friendly transport.

The train will run directly from the terminal in Cremona in Italy to the terminal in Skaraborg in Sweden, with one of the shortest transit times on the market of 2 days from terminal to terminal. This means fast, affordable and reliable transport of goods for our customers.

The new rail service will be somewhat unique and the plan is to bring goods both for the Swedish and the Norwegian market, and return goods to Italy.

Environmental focus

ColliCare is investing heavily in developing rail services, aiming to offer new alternatives and more environmentally friendly solutions by moving goods from road to rail. ColliCare is committed to following the Paris Agreement and taking necessary measures to reach the 1.5degree target.

"We choose to invest in this now to enable us to offer transport between Italy and Sweden with the best price and the shortest possible lead time. Our service is also the most environmentally friendly and efficient way to transport cargo. It is strategically important for us to have an environmental focus, and this train is a step in the right direction", says Per Zachrisson, Chief Development Officer of Rail at ColliCare Logistics. "We already have an established rail service since 2017 that runs fully loaded every week from the terminal in Parma, Italy to Rolvsøy in Norway".

Departure every Saturday

The train will run weekly with departure from Cremona on Saturdays, arriving in Skaraborg Monday afternoon, with the possibility of distributing the goods in Sweden Tuesday morning, with deliveries in Norway Tuesday/Wednesday.

On the import leg, the train departs from Skaraborg late Tuesday evening and arrives in Italy on Thursday afternoon. Many customers have already made contact regarding the new service, and ColliCare hopes for a bright future with freight by rail.
